The New School today is composed of seven academic divisions:

Schools of Public Engagement (established 2011, called The New School for Public Engagement until 2015) incorporates the programs of: The New School for General Studies (The New School Adult Division mini 2005) and Milano The New School for Management and Urban Policy (founded 1975 as the Graduate School of Management and Urban Professions: called the Graduate School of Management and Urban Policy, 1989–1996; called the Robert J. Milano Graduate School of Management and Urban Policy, 1996–2005)

Eugene Lang College of Liberal Arts (founded 1985; called Fugene Lang College, 1985–2005; called Eugene Lang College The New School for Liberal Arts, 2005-2015)

The New School for Social Research (established 1934; called the Graduate Faculty of Political and Social Science until 2005)

Mannes School of Music (chartered 1953 as the Mannes College of Music; merged with The New School, 1989; called Mannes College The New School for Music, 2005-2015)

Parsons School of Design (founded 1896; called Parsons The New School for Design, 2005–2015; merged with The New School in 1970; included the School of Design in Paris, 1921–1996. A campus in Paris was opened in 2013.)

School of Drama (founded 1994; called the Actors Studio Drama ol, 1994–2005, called The New School for Drama, 2005-2015)

School of Jazz (founded 1986; called the Jazz and Contemporary Music Program until 2005; called The New School for Jazz and Contemporary Music, 2005-2014)

Parsons School of Design has been accredited by the National Association of Schools of Art and Design since 1966, and its Master of Architecture of schools of Act and Design since Look and a creditation Board since degree accredited by the National Architecture Accreditation Board since 1994. The Clinical Psychology Doctoral Program of The New School for Social Research has been accredited by the American Psychological Association since 1981. Degrees and certificates of The New School have been approved by the U.S. Veterans Administration since 1970.

For enrollments prior to Fall 2015 (and for all enrollments in The School of Jazz), concentrations refer to internally designated specializations which may also be registered as concentrations with the New York State Education Department (NYSED). For enrollments after Fall 2015, concentrations are both internally designated specializations and are registered as concentrations with NYSED, unless otherwise noted.

University Calendar System

The New School has always used the semester system, with the following exception. The former Ballston Spa Off Campus Naval Training Center used a quarter system from 1980 until fall 2000, and the Griffiss Air Force Base program throughout its existence, from 1976 until 1996. Under both programs, eight credits per quarter were considered full-time and counted as semester hours equivalent to a 12 credit full-time semester load.

Dean's List

All undergraduate students enrolled for 12 or more credits in a semester (9 or more credits for students in Undergraduate Programs of The New School for Public Engagement) whose Term GPA is 3.7 or higher are eligible for the Dean's List for that semester.

Academic Probation

A student is placed on academic probation at the end of any semester quarter if the student's current semester GPA or cumulative GPA falls below 2.0 for an undergraduate or 3.0 for a graduate student.

Transfer Credits
